

Isn't it finally time to learn Greek? Read, Write, Communicate.

Beginning in the Fall we will be offering a **Greek Language Course for Adults (16+)**. The course will be taught by Dr. Michael Bizimis of USC. A two-semester, year-long course. Twenty-nine, 90-minute lessons, Sunday after coffee hour (12:45-2:30 pm) beginning September 30 through May 19th.

—Bilingual English-Greek textbook, plus student workbook. CD with audio material for practice, plus on-line material. The material is amenable to self guided learning, which allows for some flexibility in class attendance.

—Class is offered for those with very basic knowledge of Greek (recognize letters, sounds, read and recognize basic Greek words). If you are interested in the course but have no prior knowledge of Greek, additional introductory classes can be arranged, prior to the course start.

—Tuition: \$250 per semester. Student textbook, workbook, and other educational fees: \$90 (one time payment).

Registration deadline, with payment (\$340, 1st semester plus fees), by **August 25th**. Second payment (\$250), by January 27. Books will be ordered in bulk through Holy Trinity, so it is important to adhere to the deadlines. For additional information, contact Dr. Michael Bizimis at mbizimis@gmail.com. The Second Antiphon

Save us, O Son of God, risen from the dead, we sing to You, Alleluia.

Only begotten Son and Word of God, being immortal, You descended for our salvation to take flesh from the holy Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary and, without change, became man. Christ, our God, You were crucified and conquered death by death. Being one of the Holy Trinity, glorified with the Father and the Holy Spirit: Save us.

The Readings

The reading is from **St. Paul's First Letter to the 1 Corinthians 4:9-16**.

Brethren, God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, like men sentenced to death; because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honor, but we in disrepute. To the present hour we hunger and thirst, we are ill-clad and buffeted and homeless, and we labor, working with our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; when slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become, and are now, as the refuse of the world, the off-scouring of all things. I do not write this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel. I urge you, then, be imitators of me.

The Reading is from Matthew 17:14-23

At that time, a man came up to Jesus and kneeling before him said, "Lord, have mercy on my son, for he is an epileptic and he suffers terribly; for often he falls into the fire, and often into the water. And I brought him to your disciples, and they could not heal him." And Jesus answered, "O faithless and perverse generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him here to me." And Jesus rebuked him, and the demon came out of him, and the boy was cured instantly. Then the disciples came to Jesus privately and said, "Why could we not cast it out?" He said to them, "Because of your little faith. For truly I say to you, if you have faith as a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move hence to yonder place,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you. But this kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting." As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of man is to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day."
